

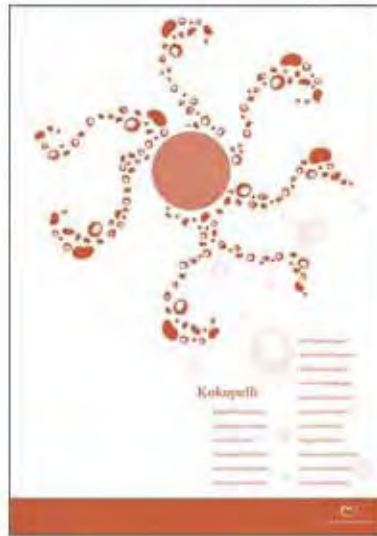


Kokopelli

I became inundated in this quaint town and began to visualize the disconnect among its people.

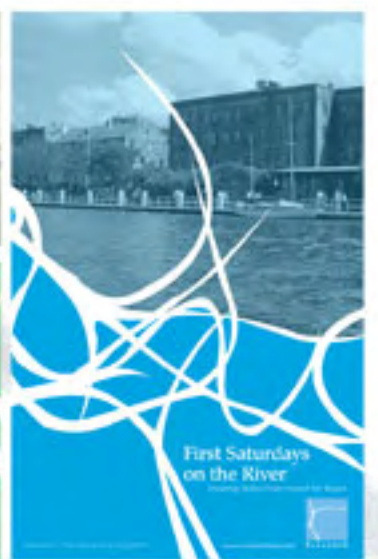
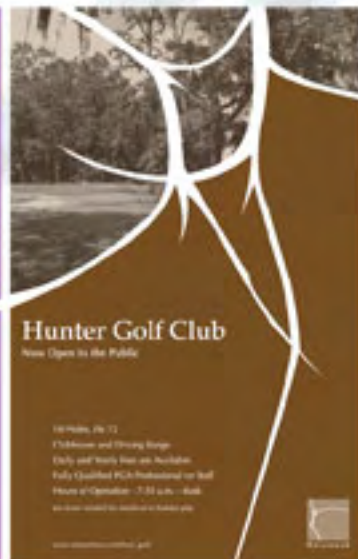
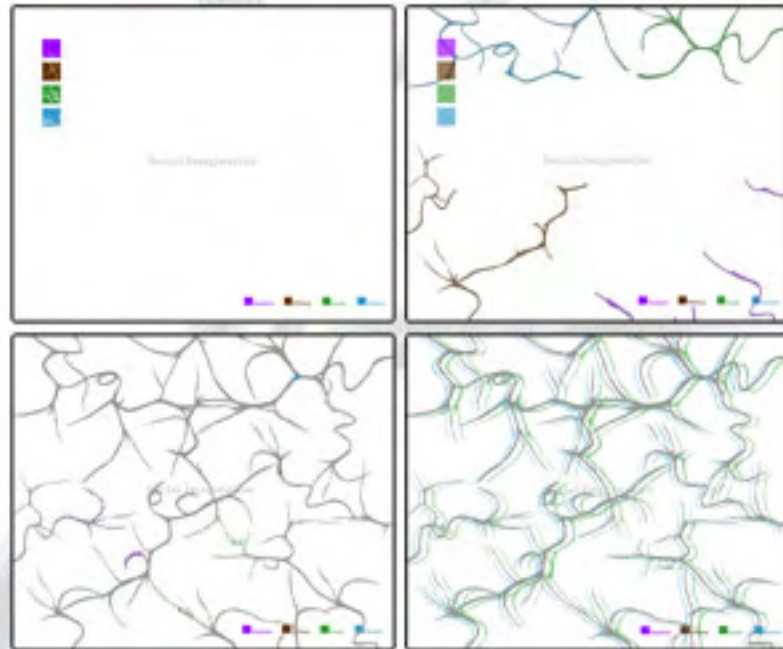
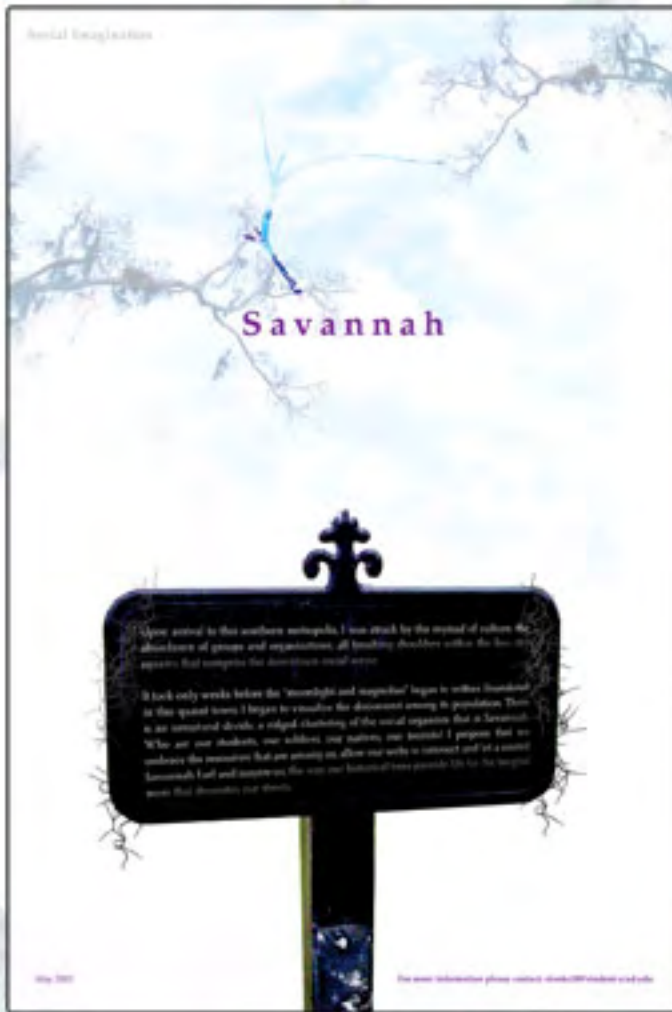
There is an unnatural divide, a rigid clustering of the social organism that is Savannah.
